

Wesleyan College's Department of Chemistry and Physics invites applications for a full-time, one-year visiting position in Chemistry, starting August 6, 2008, with the possibility of a tenure-track, assistant professor appointment for exceptional applicants. A Ph. D. in chemistry, environmental chemistry, environmental science, or a related field is required. Experience with analytical instrumentation, including atomic absorption spectroscopy, is preferred. Further, the applicant must be familiar with current environmental science pedagogy and research, and deeply committed to undergraduate instruction. Duties will include teaching introductory environmental science, environmental chemistry, and a seminar-style course that examines environmental issues from economic and political perspectives. Additional chemistry courses will include courses in general chemistry or possibly an upper-level chemistry course in accordance with the successful candidate's area of expertise. Wesleyan College is a small, liberal arts college for women located in Macon, Georgia. The chemistry and environmental science programs are among those housed in the new state-of-the-art Munroe Science Center at the College.
