Rhodes Scholars are appointed for two years of study at the University of Oxford in England. Candidates are selected on the basis of scholastic achievement, fondness for and success in sports, and "strength of moral character." U.S. citizens under the age of 24 who will be college graduates at the time the award is made may apply.

250 Goldwater Scholarships are awarded by the Goldwater Foundation nationally each year. They are given to top students who plan to enter the sciences, mathematics, or engineering fields.

90 Truman Scholarships are awarded nationally each year by the Truman Foundation. They are awarded to students who demonstrate excellence in academics and public service.

Each year, USA Today selects the "best of the best," considered as the 20 top students in the nation, for its First Team. USA Today also includes second and third teams and honorable mentions in its "All American Academic Team."

75 Javits Fellowships are awarded each year in humanities and social sciences. The Javits Fellowship provides for four years of graduate tuition at the graduate institution of the student's choice plus a \$15,000 a year stipend for study at the master's and doctoral levels.

The \$15,000 Ruth Lilly Fellowship, established in 1989 by Ruth Lilly, niece of philanthropist Eli Lilly, is presented annually to two undergraduate or graduate poets. The two awardees for the Fellowship are chosen in a national competition of more than 100 applicants from the country's best writing programs and is one of the largest awards given to aspiring writers in the United States.

The Portz Fund is named in honor of John and Edythe Portz. Dr. John Portz was one of the founders of the National Collegiate Honors Council. Each year the NCHC gives three Portz Awards. These Portz Scholars are chosen from the national pool of Honors students of which each institution may submit only one entry. A \$250 stipend is awarded at the presentation of their papers at the NCHC conference. In order to qualify for this award, students must write a paper in either Arts & Sciences, Social & Behavioral Sciences, Creative Arts & Writing, or Interdisciplinary.
